Voluntourism might have acquired a mixed reputation over the years, but truth be told, there's no better way to engage with and learn about a new culture than by using your skills to get stuck into something that will make a difference. On the map since 2005, World Expeditions' voluntourism program has sent more than 400 travellers - young and old - out into the world, and mobilised more than 30 community development and conservation projects in the process. The premise is simple: devote three or four days out of your regular holiday to work on a local project and in doing so, give something back that will continue to be of help long after your holiday is over. Building on their successes, this year World Expeditions has launched a new website dedicated solely to their not-for-profit voluntourism projects. Named Community Project Travel, the site acts as a hub for accessing the latest itineraries. School upgrades in Nepal, wildlife protection in Kenya, cape-to-cape beach clean ups in Western Australia or rock art community projects in the Territory - there's a huge range of locations and projects on offer. Tailor your own holiday, or choose from a range of pre-designed itineraries, which include accommodation, meals, transport and activities, all centred around a community development, health or education initiative. communityprojecttravel.com

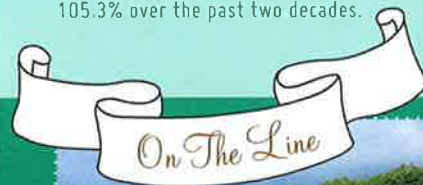
